## **Dance Major Advising**

## **Dance Faculty Advisors**

- All Dance major students will be assigned a Dance faculty advisor to assist with Dance course planning and keep the Dance major form (BA or BFA) and Dance file up-to-date.
- Notice about advising assignments will be communicated to Dance major students via email on an annual basis, and/or if any change in advising assignments occur.
- Dance major students are responsible to manage their coursework and graduation planning and meet with both their Dance faculty advisor and college advisor as needed for guidance.

## **Dance Faculty Advising Meetings**

- During their first semester as a degree-seeking student or their first semester after acceptance by audition, Dance major students should meet with the Dance faculty advisor assigned for new Dance major students to map a course plan and fill out a BA or BFA Dance major form. The typed Dance major form must be signed by both the Dance faculty advisor and the student before it can be sent to the College of Liberal Arts for major declaration. Every Dance major student will have an individual file including the master copy of the Dance major form, four year plan, contact information, performance resume, and all pertinent information related to Dance requirements.
- Dance major students should meet with their Dance faculty advisor at least once per year to complete a Dance advising checklist and update their Dance major form, and file contents including performance resume and contact information.
- Dance major students planning to graduate must meet with their Dance faculty advisor during their final semester on campus to finalize their Dance major form and have a Dance Program graduation clearance memo signed and sent to their college advising office.

# **College Advising**

Dance majors are strongly encouraged to utilize advising resources in the College of Liberal Arts. # **Double Majoring with Dance**

Students who wish to pursue a double major or dual degree with Dance are encouraged to consider the BA degree. Due to credit requirements and course sequencing, students who wish to pursue a double

major with a BFA should plan on more than four years of undergraduate study. Dance major students pursuing a double major or dual degree are strongly encouraged to work closely with all of their relevant advisors in considering their four-year planning and any potential conflicts of required coursework in each area of study.

#### **Dance and Dance-related Electives**

#### **Dance Electives - BA**

At least 9 credits = dance academic or dance-related academic At least 9 credits (of total 12) = 3xxx level or above No more than 3 credits = technique/studio = 12 credits total

#### **Dance Electives - BFA**

At least 12 credits = dance academic or dance-related academic At least 12 credits (of total 18) = 3xxx level or above No more than 6 credits = technique/studio = 18 credits total (including 'Ethnology' requirements)

Students are required to take coursework that fulfills Dance Major elective requirements under the A/F grading system.

A course cannot fulfill a Dance Major elective requirement if the course is a requirement for a student's second major or minor program.

Prerequisites for required Dance technique courses (e.g. Modern 4) do not fulfill technique electives for the Dance Major.

All Dance Major elective courses must be documented on the student's Dance Major BA or BFA form by the Dance faculty advisor.

Beginning Fall Semester 2011, Dance academic elective courses not on the list of suggested Dance academic electives must be submitted to the Dance faculty advisor and Coordinator/Director for approval. Students who wish to submit an elective course for consideration must submit the course syllabus and a short justification for why the course relates to the student's understanding of dance or dance studies. Correspondence and approvals for Dance academic electives not on the suggested elective list will be documented in the student's file for future reference and graduation clearance.

The list of suggested Dance electives will be reviewed by the Dance Faculty on a periodic basis.

## **Transfer Credits, Waivers, Directed Studies**

- Approval to fulfill/waive University of Minnesota Dance requirements with transfer credits from another institution in related academic, creative, or production dance courses will be evaluated by the Dance Program advisor in consultation with the instructor of the University of Minnesota Dance Program related course and approval by the Director of Dance. Transfer courses in consideration must be credited from a peer institution and appear on the student's transcript. Students should submit a course syllabus and other relevant course information for faculty review.
- Approval to fulfill/waive University of Minnesota Dance performance requirements (i.e. DNCE 3700, 5700) with transfer credits from another institution will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis by the Dance Program faculty advisor in consultation with the University of Minnesota Dance Program faculty and approval by the Director of Dance. Performance opportunities must be a credited course from a peer institution and appear on the student's transcript. Students should submit the name of the faculty or guest artist choreographer, a description of the work and/or working process, the performance dates and venue, and the rehearsal and technical rehearsal time frame. The faculty will consider the stature of the artist and a student's individual trajectory in the degree program. BA and BFA students must complete at least one performance opportunity on the University of Minnesota campus to fulfill graduation requirements in performance.

- The Director of Dance must approve all waivers, exceptions, or changes to required Dance coursework in consultation with appropriate teaching faculty. Approval for waivers to required courses must be documented in the Dance Major file by the Dance faculty advisor.
- Core curricular coursework in Dance, including academic courses, may not be taken as Directed Study credits with the exception of extraordinary circumstances in consultation with the instructor of the course and approval by the Director of Dance.

## **Individualized Degrees with Dance**

Students proposing a Dance concentration with an individualized degree must meet the following criteria before submitting a BIS or IDIM (or other relevant individualized degree across colleges) proposal to the college:

- Attend an information/orientation session with the appropriate individualized degree advising office.
- Meet with the Director of the Dance to discuss areas of interest and concentration in Dance.
   The Director of Dance must sign off on an initial proposed list of 3xxx or 5xxx level courses
   BEFORE the individualized degree proposal is submitted to the college.
- Individualized degree –seeking students including Dance coursework are generally encouraged
  to complete courses in at least two areas of the dance curriculum: dance academic courses,
  creative/compositional courses, and/or technique and performance courses. Students
  including Dance in a degree plan are expected to take at least one Dance Studies course to
  provide a theoretical foundation in Dance.
- An audition with minimum placement level results may be required before the initial individualized degree proposal is approved by the Director of Dance. Individualized degree students who wish to include technique courses in a BIS or IDIM proposal must demonstrate that completing 3xxx level intermediate technique courses is feasible within a reasonable time frame for graduation planning. Students who wish to include Modern, Ballet, Jazz, and/or African Diasporic Movement courses are encouraged to participate in a scheduled group Dance Program Major or Technique Placement audition as quickly as possible. The Director of Dance will not approve a BIS/IDIM plan that includes only technique/studio courses.
